 CHAPTER 266.

Passed Mar. 20, 1867. AN ACT entitled, an Act to incorporate the Annapolis Hotel Company.

Incorporated. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That John W. Crisfield, Michael Somers and Hance Lawson, their associates, successors and assigns, who may hereafter become subscribers and stockholders, be and they are created, constituted and made a body corporate for the purpose of building, establishing and maintaining at Crisfield, in Somerset county, a hotel for public accommodation, under the name and style of the "Annapolis Hotel Company," by which name they shall have perpetual succession, may sue and be sued, have and use a common seal, acquire, possess and dispose of real and personal estates, ordain and establish ordinances, regulations and by-laws for its own government, and do all such acts and things as are necessary and proper to carry into effect this Act and promote the object and design of the corporation hereby created.

Capital stock. Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the capital stock of said corporation shall not be less than ten thousand dollars or more than one hundred thousand dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars each, and on each share of stock there shall be paid at the time of subscription the sum of ten dollars to said associates or some one of them, who are hereby appointed Commissioners to organize the
