The question on the adoption of Mr. Kimmel's amendment, was then determined in the affirmative.

The Committee on Judicial Proceedings submitted the following amendments:

Section 1, line 3, after the word "Baltimore," strike out the words "and the additional articles adopted by the Act of the General Assembly, passed at the session of 1860, chapter 6, the additional sections adopted by the Act of the General Assembly, at the session of 1860, chapter 46," and insert in lieu thereof, the words "and chapter 131, passed at the December session of 1861, entitled, an Act to repeal sections 806, 809, 810, 811, 815 and 821, of the 4th article of the Code of Public Local Laws relating to Baltimore and the organization of a Board of Police therefor, and to re-enact the same with amendments, and in line 10, same section, strike out after the word "and," the words "the third section; in line 14 and 15, same section, strike out the figures "823," the word "and," and the figures "824."

Section 1, in line 16, after the word "amendment," insert the words additional sections 823, 824, 825 and 826.

Which were read and adopted.

Mr. Vickers moved a call of the Senate,

The Senate resumed the consideration of the Baltimore Police bill;
