7th. Amend section 9, 6th line, by inserting after the word "respects," the word "be."

8th. Amend by striking out section 11.

9th. Amend section 12 by striking out in third line all after the words "and the" to the word "Bailiff," in 4th line; also strike out fifth line and insert in lieu thereof the words "constables now receive."

10th. Amend section 13, 7th line, by inserting after the word "five," the words "of not less than two nor more than ten dollars;" also after the word "imprisonment" the words "for not less than ten nor more than twenty days in the county jail."
