Whereas, the Act of Congress 1866, chapter 245, directs that the Legislature shall proceed to elect a person to fill such vacancy in the manner prescribed in that Act, on the second Tuesday after the Legislature shall have been organized, and shall have notice of such vacancy, we therefore propose with the concurrence of your Honorable Body, to proceed to elect a person to fill such vacancy in the manner prescribed in the aforesaid Act of Congress at 12 o'clock, this day, it being the second Tuesday after this Legislature hath had notice of such vacancy.
