Section 10, amend by inserting after the word "dollars in line 6, "or forfeit the canoe or other boat so used or employed;"

Line 1, section 22, strike out "Comptroller of the Treasury" and insert the "Governor."

Section 29, line 9, before the word "provided" insert "and that any other citizen of the county shall have power to locate and appropriate any waters in said county (five acres) not located or appropriated by the 1st day of January, 1868;"
