

At the end of section 29, "and further provided that no natural bar or bed of oysters shall be located or appropriated;"

Which was read and adopted.

Mr. Waters submitted the following as an additional section:

Section 32. And be it enacted that the State's portion of all fines and forfeitures accruing under any section of this article, shall be paid by the sheriff or other officer collecting the same, to the Clerk of the Circuit Court of the county, or the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas of the city of Baltimore, where such fine or forfeiture may occur, and such clerk shall account for the same to the Comptroller of the Treasury in his semi-annual returns.

Which was read and adopted.

The bill was then read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Was read the third time by special order, three-fourths concurring, and passed by yeas and nays as follow:
