And delivered the following bills:

A bill entitled, an Act, supplementary to an Act, entitled, “An Act to provide for the general valuation and assessment of property in this State,” passed at the extra session of the General Assembly, in the year 1866, chapter 157;

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

A bill entitled, an Act to authorize Thomas McCrea, Jr., of Howard county, to act in the double capacity of Justice of the Peace, and Assistant Inspector;

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

Mr. Waters, from the select Committee, reported a bill entitled, an Act to authorize and direct the County Commissioners of Somerset county to levy a sum of money to build a bridge over the Eastern branch of the Wicomico river at Salisbury;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Vickers, from the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, reported a bill entitled, an Act to add the following sections to article 81, of the Code of Public General Laws, title Revenue and Taxes, sub-title, direct taxes, relating to the sale of real and leasehold estates for taxes in the several counties;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Vickers, from the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, reported a bill entitled, an Act to authorize Loudon Park Cemetery, to make and enforce calls or assessments upon its capital stock;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Vickers, from the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, reported a bill entitled, an Act to incorporate the Chester Lodge, No. 115 of Ancient Free and Accepted Masons;

Which was read the first time.
