The rules were suspended, and the bill read the second time by special order;

On motion by Mr. Davis, of Washington,

Said bill was referred to the Committee on Finance.

A bill entitled, an Act to appropriate a sum of money to pay Longnecker & Conner, M. Fields and others;

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

A bill entitled, an Act to refund a sum of money paid into the State Treasury erroneously by John M. Bond of the 5th election district, of Baltimore county;

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

A bill entitled, an Act to pay Wm. Price a sum of money for legal services rendered the State by direction of the Governor, and also, to pay Daniel R. Magruder a sum of money for his expenses, paid in obtaining the position of Circuit Judge of the second Judicial Circuit;

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

A bill entitled, an Act to provide for the payment of pensions to Maryland soldiers of the war of 1812, and widows of deceased soldiers of 1812;

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Pensions.

And returned the following bills:

A bill entitled, an Act for the repayment out of the storage and outage on tobacco of monies heretofore demanded and received by the Inspector of Tobacco, in violation of the Acts of 1864, chapter 346, and 1865, chapter 194,
