Amend title, by striking out all after the word "repeal," in the first line, and insert the following, chapter 247, passed January session, 1864, entitled "An Act to add an additional section to article thirty of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Crimes and Punishments."

Amend first section, by striking out all after the word "Maryland," in the first line down to the words "as follows" in the fourth line inclusive, and insert the following: "that the Act passed at January session, 1864, chapter 247, entitled, an Act to add an additional section to article thirty of the Code of Public General Laws relating to Crimes and Punishments, is hereby repealed, and re-enacted so as to read.

Amend second section, by inserting after the word "Baltimore," in the thirteenth line the word "Kent."

In the 10th line strike out the word "six" before the word "months," and insert the word "two."

Which was read and adopted.

Mr. Compton submitted the following amendment:

Amend, by adding "Queen Anne's, Montgomery, St. Mary's, Charles, Howard and Baltimore counties."

Which was read and adopted.
