

Mr. Vickers, from the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an Act to repeal an Act entitled, an Act to authorize Mrs. Margaret Sherwood, wife of Hugh Sherwood, of Talbot county, to close a public road leading through her lands in said county, passed at the January session of the General Assembly, 1864, chapter 323;

Mr. Vickers, from the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, reported a bill entitled, an Act to repeal section 25 of article 38, of the Code of Public General Laws, title, Fees of Officers, sub-title Notaries Public, and to re-enact the same with amendments ;

Which was read the first time.

The bill entitled, an Act to repeal sub-section 5 of chapter 194, of Laws of Maryland, passed January session, 1865, entitled, an Act to repeal and re-enact sections 5, 26 and 27, of an Act passed January session, 1864, chapter 346, entitled, an Act to amend article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the leasing of the State Tobacco Warehouses and the inspection of tobacco, and to re-enact the same, also, to repeal sections 9, 11, 12, 15, 17, 18, 19, 22, 25; 26, 27 and 28, of chapter 346, of Laws of Maryland, passed January session, 1864, and to re-enact the same with amendments, and to annex additional sections to come in after section 50 of said Act ;
