Which was read the first time.

Mr. Stirling, from the Committee on Corporations, reported a bill entitled, an Act to incorporate the Contractor's Association;

The Clerk of the House of Delegates returned the bill entitled, an Act to assist the President and Managers of the Maryland Disabled Soldiers' Home to procure a building suitable to an enlarged exercise of their charitable purposes;
