Which was read the first time.

Mr. Earle from the Committee on Finance, to which was referred the bill entitled, an Act for the benefit of the Library Company of the Baltimore Bar ;

Reported it with the following amendments :

Amend section 1, line 2, strike out after the words "sum of" the words "one thousand," and insert in their place the words "five hundred."

Amend section 1, line 4, by inserting after the word "use," the words "for two successive years."

Amend section 3, line 1, by striking out the words "one thousand." and inserting in their place the words "five hundred."

Which were read and adopted.
