Endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

A bill entitled, an Act to incorporate the Maryland Metallic and Chemical Company of Baltimore,

Endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

A bill entitled, an Act to authorize the Commissioners of Charles county to refund to the heirs of W. H. Williams. taxes paid in error,

Endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

A bill entitled, an Act to incorporate the Maryland Industrial Agency, and to aid railroad companies, farmers and others to obtain loans and advances of money and of credits upon more favorable terms than such loans and credits are usually given by banks,

Endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

A bill entitled, an Act for the protection of the public against medical imposters and for the suppression of the crime of unlawful abortion,

Endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

A bill entitled, on Act to appropriate one hundred thousand dollars for the relief of destitute people in States wasted by civil war,

Endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

A bill entitled, an Act to secure settlement with the County Commissioners of the several counties, and the Register of the city of Baltimore, for bounty funds paid by the Treasurer,

Endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

The bill entitled, an Act to make valid the official acts of Justices of the Peace appointed by Governor Bradford, during the months of December, 1865, and January 1866,

Was read the third time, and passed by yeas and nays as follow :
