Amend section 1, line 4, after 1864, by adding "and also such other persons who entered the service or furnished substitutes who were mustered into the service of the United States and credited to the call of the President of the 19th December, 1864 ;"

Which was read and adopted.

Mr. Tome submitted the following amendment :

Add at end of section 1 :

"Provided said volunteer and drafted men have been regularly mustered by a duly authorized officer of the United States and accredited to the quotas of the State of Maryland ;"

Which was adopted.
