The President then announced the order of the day, being the bill entitled, an Act to provide for the running of the Baltimore City Passenger Railway cars on Sunday, supplementary to an Act to incorporate the Baltimore City Passenger Railway Company, passed February 13, 1862, chapter 71.

Mr. Vickers moved to lay the bill on the table.
