

The Senate proceeded to the consideration of the bill entitled an Act to repeal sub-sections 179 and 180, with section 2, of chapter 66, of January Session 1866, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Section 1, 8th line, after the word "his," insert the words "or her," at the end of same line insert after "his," the words "or her," at the end of 9th line, insert after "his," the words "or her," 12th line, insert after the word "his," the words "or her."

Which was read and adopted.

Mr. Bowie, submitted the following amendment :

Strike out the words "of absolute necessity," in the 7th line of 1st section, and insert "where prescribed by a Physician in good standing;"

Which was read and adopted.

Said bill was referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.
