Which was read and adopted.

Mr. Tome submitted the following amendment:

Provided, that if said road should be constructed over navigable waters, said company is required to build a draw in the most navigable part of said stream to pass vessels by day or by night through said bridge or bridging, free of charge.

Which was read and adopted.

The bill was then read the third time and passed by yeas and nays as follow:
