by the Senate be placed by the printer at the disposal of Dr. Higgins, to be distributed by him in the discharge of the duties of his office as Immigrant Agent of the State of Maryland;

Which was read and adopted.

The bill entitled, an Act to incorporate the People's Fire Insurance Company of Baltimore;

Was read the third time and passed by yeas and nays as follow:

Mr. Vickers submitted the following amendment:

Provided that no negro or mulatto shall be admitted to testify in any case, in any court or before any Justice of the Peace, where a white person is a party, unless a negro or mulatto shall be one of the parties to the suit,
