Mr. Mules, from the Committee on Corporations, to which was referred the bill, entitled An Act, to incorporate the Real Estate Fire Insurance Company, of Baltimore, reported it with the following amendments:

AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

After the word "notice," in sixth line, section 3, insert as follows: "at least ten days daily prior to the time for holding the election of directors of said company, in three newspapers published in the city of Baltimore." Striking out all after the word "notice," in sixth line, section 3, to the word "call," in seventh line, same section. Fourth line, 14th section, after the word "thereafter," add "the General Assembly reserving the right to alter, amend or modify any or all of the provisions of this Act at its pleasure.
