

CITIZENSHIP, RIGHTS OF—

Leave granted to report a bill to enfranchise and restore Albert T. Emory and J. West Thompson, Jr., to the full, 11.

Message to the House proposing the appointment of a Joint Committee to report a bill for the enfranchisement and restoration of certain citizens to full, 14; message asking the return of message, 21; message received concurring, 27.

Leave granted to withdraw from the files, the bill to restore to the full, all persons disqualified by the 4th section of article 1, of the Constitution, from voting and from holding any office, 20.

House bill to restore to full citizenship, and the right to vote and hold office, all persons who may be deprived thereof by the provisions contained in the 4th section of the 1st article of the Constitution of this State, read and referred, 45; reported without amendment, and read the second time, 93, proceedings on, 102, 103; read the third time and passed, 104; returned to the House, *ib.*

Leave granted to report a bill to provide for correcting the lists of qualified voters, by adding thereto the names of citizens of this State, who have been restored to their full, and for amending the article of the Code of Public General Laws entitled Registration, 96; bill reported, and read the first time, 98; amended, read the second and third times, and passed, 109; sent to the House, *ib.*
