investigation of the water resources.

State Soil Conservation Committee

Established By: Md. Code Ann., art. 66C, § 91.

Head: Committee designates its chairman from membership.

Members: Director of the Maryland Experiment Station; the director

of the Maryland Department of State Forests and Parks; chairman of the State Board of Agriculture; dean of agriculture of the University of Maryland; the director of the Department of Game and Inland Fish; three soil conservation district supervisors, each of whom serve for a term of a year, to be appointed by the State Board of Agriculture; and principal administrative officer for Maryland of the Soil Conservation Service, United States Department of Agriculture; director of Department of Water Resources; and Director of the Maryland Agricultural Extension Service.

District supervisors serve 3 year terms.

Soil conservation information and coordination.
