IDAHO	1890	Art. XIV, §§ 1-6; males 18-45; conscientious objectors excused; legislature provides organization; officers commissioned by governor; legislature provides armories; no importation of armed police force permitted.		Governor is commander-in-chief.
ILLINOIS	1870	Art. XII, §§ 1-6; males 18-45; legislature organizer; officers commissioned by governor; conscientious objectors pay.		Governor is commander-in-chief.
INDIANA	1851	Art. XII, §§ 1-6; males 18-45; legislature provides organization; governor appoints adjutant, quartermaster & commissary generals; legislature determines divisions and classes; conscientious objectors pay for exemption.		Governor is commander-in-chief.
IOWA	1857	Art. VI, §§ 1-3; males 18-45; conscientious objectors exempted for equivalent in money; officers elected by particular groups, commissioned by governor.		Governor is commander-in-chief.
KANSAS	1861	Art. VIII, §§ 1-4; males 21-45; conscientious objectors exempted under condition prescribed by law; legislature provides for organization; officers elected or appointed and commissioned as prescribed by law; governor is commander-in-chief.		
KENTUCKY	1891	The Militia §§ 219-23; males 18-45; legislature provides for organization; conscientious objectors exempt; pay money for exemption; election and appointment of officers detailed; armories for safekeeping.		Governor is commander-in-chief.
