Article I, Section 6: oath by governor, assemblymen and judges not to take the profits of another office.

Article II, Section 15: The governor may remove all "civil officers" he has appointed for a term of years.

Article III, Section 11: no one holding office of profit, or trust, except justice of the peace, may be an assemblyman.

Article III, Section 17: no assemblyman may occupy "any office" created during his term.

Although the standards appear to be definite, it is apparent upon examination of the following list of the Court's decisions and rulings by the Attorney General that such determinations are made on a case-by-case basis.
