In case two or more persons, legally qualified, according to the provisions of the constitution of this State, shall have an equal number of legal votes, than and in that case, the Chancellor shall communicate the fact, within ten days after the reception of the election returns, of the State, in writing to the then Governor, whose duty it shall be, and who is hereby authorized, and directed, to convene, by proclamation, upon reasonable notice, the General Assembly, before whom the Chancellor shall forthwith lay all the election returns, and the Senate, and House of Delegates, upon joint ballot, shall determine which one of them shall be Governor, and the one which, upon counting the ballots, shall have the highest number of votes, shall be Governor, and shall qualify as such.
