The Governor shall have power to fill any vacancy that may occur in any such offices during the recess of the Senate, by granting Commissions which shall expire upon the appointment of the same person, or any other person, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate to the same office, or at the expiration of one calendar month, ensuing the commencement of the next regular session of the Senate whichever shall first occur.</p> <p>Proposed by Act of 1836, chapter 197. Ratified 1837.</p> <p>Sec. 16. The same person shall in no case be nominated by the Governor a second time during the same Session, for the same office, in case he shall have been rejected by the Senate, unless after such rejection, the Senate shall inform the Governor by message, of their willingness to receive again the nomination of such rejected person, for further consideration, and in case any person nominated by the Governor for any office, shall have been rejected by the Senate, it shall not be lawful for the Governor at any time afterwards, during the recess of the Senate, in case of vacancy in the same office to appoint such rejected person to fill said vacancy.</p>
