The Lieutenant Governor shall, by virtue of his office, be President of the Senate, and whenever the Senate are equally divided, shall have the right to give the casting vote.</p> <p>Sec. 9. Whenever the office of Governor shall be administered by the Lieutenant Governor, or he shall be unable to attend as President of the Senate, the Senate shall elect one of its own members as President, <i>pro tempore</i>.</p>
Lieutenant Governor: Compensation.			<p>Sec. 10. The Lieutenant Governor, while he acts as President of the Senate, shall receive for his services the same compensation which shall for the same period be allowed to the Speaker of the House of Delegates, and no more.</p>
