[the appointed commissioners] are hereby authorized if they shall deem it necessary for the convenience of the Voters of Said County to lay off and divide anew, Cecil County into Separate Election districts not excluding in number seven. . . .</p> <p>All that part of the second Election district of Anne Arundel County lying out of the City of Annapolis shall constitute and Compose the Second Election District of said County.</p> <p>The City of Annapolis shall constitute the Sixth Election District of said County for all Elections hereafter to be held for Sheriffs, Electors of President and vice President and Electors of the Senate of this State and for a member of Congress of Said election shall be held by the Mayor, Recorder and Altermen of the said City of any three or more of them at such place within the said city as they may appoint.</p> <p><b>Proposed by Acts of 1835, chapter 264.
