A BEQUEST of FURNITURE as an (A) Heir-Loom.

Item,-I give and bequeath unto the faid M. A. and W. A. their executors, administrators, and affigns, all the furniture, houshold fluff, and utenfils in or belonging to my mansion house at (other than, and except my filver plate, which I will shall be taken, deemed and accounted as part of my personal estate) also all the orange trees and lemon trees, and all other greens and plants in, about or belonging to my faid mansion house, or the gardens to the fame belonging; UPON TRUST pevertheless to permit and suffer the fame to continue and remain as heir-looms in and about the faid house, for the use of every fuch person and persons, who for the time being, shall respectively be seised or possessed of the freehold of the same mansion-house and premises, by force and virtue of any devise or limitation thereof in this my last will and testa-
