“ tended testamentary words, no testimony  
“ shall be received to prove any will *nuncupative*,  
“ except the said testimony, or the substance  
“ thereof were committed to writing with-  
“ in six days after the making of the said  
“ will.”

“ And be it further enacted, that no letters  
“ testamentary, or probate of any *nuncupative*  
“ will, shall pass the seal of any court, till  
“ fourteen days, at the least, after the decease  
“ of the testator be fully expired: nor shall any  
“ *nuncupative* will be at any time received to be  
“ proved, unless process have first issued to call  
“ in the widow, or next of kindred to the de-  
“ ceased, to the end they may contest the same,  
“ if they please.”

No letters to  
be granted  
thereon till  
fourteen days  
after decease,  
&c.

And the same statute further enacts, with re-  
gard to the revocation of written wills, by any  
will *nuncupative*, as follows: “ and be it fur-  
“ ther enacted, that no will in writing con-  
“ cerning any goods or chattels, or personal  
“ estate, shall be repealed, nor shall any clause,  
“ devise or bequest therein be altered or changed  
“ by any words, or will by word of mouth  
“ only, except the same be in the life of the  
“ testator committed to writing, and after the  
“ writing thereof read unto the testator, and  
“ allowed

Written wills  
not revocable  
by a will  
*nuncupative*.
