Proviso.

by some creditable witness, which said receipt may be filed in the office of the clerk or register, where such judgment or decree was rendered, and it shall thereupon be the duty of the said courts respectively, immediately to enter the said judgment or decree satisfied, if the said courts respectively shall be satisfied that the said receipt was executed as it may purport to be; Provided, that the said receipt purports to be in full, and should the said receipt purport to be in part payment only, said courts shall make a like entry for the amount specified in said receipt to have been paid; and in either case said courts shall note on the docket the date of said receipt, and also when left on file, and for every such entry the clerk or register of said courts, as the case may be, shall be entitled to receive ten cents at the time of making the same.

CHAPTER 298.

A further additional Supplement to the Act of December session, eighteen hundred and twenty-seven, chapter one hundred and seventeen, entitled, an Act to regulate the issuing of Licenses to Traders, Keepers of Ordinaries, and others.

Maximum price of ordinary licenses fixed

Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That no tax shall be paid by any ordinary keeper, under the provisions of the original act to which this is a further additional supplement, or any of its supplements, exceeding the sum of one hundred, nor less than eighteen dollars per annum; which sum shall be considered as including the tax of five per cent. on the rent or annual value directed to be assessed by the act of the present session, entitled, an additional supplement to the act passed at December session, eighteen hundred and twenty-seven, chapter one hundred and seventeen, entitled, an act to regulate the issuing of licenses to traders, keepers of ordinaries, and others, any thing in the said additional supplement, to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAPTER 302.
