the said sheriffs shall be bound to receive the same for collection, and to account with, and pay to the said clerk, all sums of money by them to be received thereon, in the same manner, and at the same time, as they are now required to do by the existing laws, any law or page to the contrary notwithstanding.

Securities responsible.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That the sureties of the said sheriffs, shall be responsible for the performance of the duty of their principals in this respect, to the same extent as they are responsible for them, in relation to the fees of other officers.

To take effect.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That the provisions of this act, are intended to take effect immediately, and to be applied to the fees, by the said clerk to be sent out for collection, in this present year, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five.

CHAPTER 92.

A further Supplement to the Act, entitled, an Act for the relief of sundry Insolvent Debtors, passed at November session, eighteen hundred and five.*

Orphans court authorized to acknowledgment of conveyance

Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the judge of any orphans court, to whom, by virtue of the supplement to the act to which this is a supplement, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and seventeen, chapter one hundred and eighty-three, any insolvent debtor may apply for a discharge under the insolvent laws of this state, may take the acknowledgment of any conveyance of such applicant of his estate, for the benefit of his creditors, prescribed to be executed by the said original act, or any of the supplements thereto, to the same effect as such acknowledgment may now be taken by any two justices of the peace.

CHAPTER 105.

An Act to extend to Executors and Administrators, the privilege of appeal from Judgments rendered by Justices of the Peace, against their Testators or Intestates.

Right of appeal extended.

SEC. 1. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this act, the privilege of appeal from any judgment, rendered by any justice of the peace, as is now allowed by law to any person who may think him or herself aggrieved by the judgment of any justice of the peace, shall be, and the same hereby is extended to all and every executor or executors, administrator or administrators, of any deceased defendant, against whom, in his life-time, any judgment or judgments may have been rendered by any justice of the peace as aforesaid.
