fore,

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the aforesaid enrollment and arrangement, shall be, and the same are hereby confirmed; sub-
ject, nevertheless, to be altered as provided generally in this act; and expressly in the following manner, viz: where a major-general shall call a meeting of the brigadiers of his division, at some central place therein, and convenient time, to be by him appointed, who, or a majority of them, when so met, shall revise the arrangements and bounds of the several brigades within said division, and make any alterations of the same that may appear to them necessary; and in case of any alteration being made, the major-general shall return the same, by mail, to the adjutant-general's office, to be therein recorded; and where a brigadier shall call together the colonels, lieutenant-colonels, and majors of his brigade, at some convenient place and time, to be by him appointed, who, or a majority of them, when so met, shall revise and make any alteration that may be deemed necessary by them, in the arrangement and bounds of their several regiments, battalions, and squadrons; and said brigadier shall, as soon thereafter as may be, transmit, by mail, a return of any alterations made as aforesaid, to the adjutant-general's office, to be therein recorded; and the several commanding officers of regiments, extra battalions, and squadrons, shall convene, from time to time, as may be necessary, the commanding officers of companies, in their respective regiments, battalions, or squadrons, at some convenient place and time, to be by them severally appointed, who, or a majority of them, when so met, shall revise and make any alterations deemed by them necessary, in the arrangements and bounds of their several battalions, squadron, or companies; and the commanding officer of the regiment, extra battalion, or squadron, shall, as soon thereafter as may be, transmit, by mail, a return of any alterations made as aforesaid, to the general of his brigade, and to the adjutant-general's office, to be therein recorded.

And whereas, changes have taken place in the population since the arrangement of the militia into districts was made, as aforementioned, it shall be the duty of the major-generals of the militia of this state, and they are hereby severally required, under a penalty of two hundred dollars each, to order a meeting of the brigadier-generals, within their respective divisions, to the first day of May next, at some convenient place within their proper divisions, who, or a majority of them, when so met, shall revise the arrangements and bounds of the several brigades, within their proper divisions, and make any alteration of the same that then may appear to them necessary; and in case of any alterations being then so made, the major-general of the
