

He may punish, to the extent of thirteen lashes, and ten days' confinement on bread and water, and may authorize his deputies and under officers to give from one to five lashes for infractions of discipline; he must present a record of punishments and offences to the monthly meetings of the board, that they may judge of the condition of the discipline, and he must particularly observe that corporal punishment is resorted to as little as possible.

Extent of right to punish.

Corporal punishment

Neither the warden, nor any director, nor other person having any official relation with the prison, shall receive any reward, gift or promise from any convict, or from any one in their behalf under the penalties imposed by the thirteenth section of this act.

Receiving gifts, &c. forbid.

Penalty.

Article 5. *Assistant Warden.*—This officer shall aid the warden in carrying out the laws of the state and the regulations of the prison; he must receive and execute the warden's orders when present, but in his absence must take his place, with all the warden's powers; in the warden's absence from the prison, night or day, the assistant warden must be present; he shall have particular charge of the victualling department, and be present at meals, unless his place be taken by the warden; and he shall also examine the whole prison after the hour of locking up, and see that all is safe; his duties shall be mostly of a supervisory character over the whole prison, but shall discharge specific duties when assigned to him.

Assistant warden's duties.

Article 6. *Deputy Keepers.*—They shall continue at all times, day and night, within the prison, unless by permission of the warden, and do all the duties assigned them by the keeper, in addition to those directed by the board; they are particularly to enforce silence and labour among the prisoners, and to preserve the strictest order and discipline.

Deputy keepers' duties.

They shall not, nor shall any director nor other officer, have any work of any kind done at the prison; they must furnish approved substitutes during their absence, or the warden may appoint them at their expense; no spirits, wine, nor strong drink must be used by them, and all wrangling and disputes must be punished by the dismissal of both parties.

No person to have work done at prison. Substitute keepers. Liquors forbid. Dispute.

The board of directors shall make special regulations respecting the duties of these officers, and shall assign to them respectively by name, the offices they are to perform, and the warden shall cause their duties to be explained and made known to them, so that none can be ignorant of what they are expected to do.

Special rules directed.

Article 7. *Physician.*—The physician shall visit the prison at least once in each day, at a certain hour, and whenever his attendance may be required; he must keep a hospital journal, in which shall be entered the names of the convicts reported
