

AN ACT relating to Elections in Allegany County.—1836, ch. 160.

SEC. 1. *Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the additional district, when laid off as in said act provided, shall be known by number ten, and the said district when laid off shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges as is now secured to the other election districts in said county.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the commissioners named in said act, or a majority of them, shall have, and are hereby vested with full power to fix the places of holding the polls of that portion of the district number one, so laid off, as well as that portion remaining, and it shall be the duty of said commissioners to make return to the clerk of Allegany county, of the place so fixed upon by them, to be recorded in the records of Allegany county, and the said clerk shall immediately cause notice to be given of the places of holding said elections, in the newspapers printed in Cumberland, Allegany county, not less than ten days previous to holding the next elections in said county.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That in case the commissioners, who are authorized to lay off said district, shall lay off the same as is required by the act in the preamble recited, it shall be the duty of the commissioners of Allegany county, to appoint three suitable persons to act as judges of elections in the said district, who shall have, hold and exercise the same powers as other judges of the elections in Allegany county now exercise and enjoy.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted,* That the citizens of each of said districts shall elect one person as a commissioner of Allegany county, in the manner pointed out by the act of assembly, passed in the year eighteen hundred and twenty-nine, chapter twenty-five, and shall be subject to all the powers and restrictions therein mentioned.

A SUPPLEMENT to an ACT, entitled, an Act to provide for electing Commissioners for Allegany County, and prescribing their power and duties, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and twenty-nine, chapter twenty-five.—1838, ch. 5.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, no provision is made in the law enacted on the twenty-eighth day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty, giving to the people of Allegany county, the right to choose their commissioners of tax by ballot, to determine in case of tie between two or more of the candidates, for the said office of county commissioners; *And whereas,* it appears from the returns of the judges of election for Allegany county, that at the last October election, there was a tie vote between two of the candidates running for said office of county commissioners, in the Flintstone district, in said county; therefore,
