

AN ACT to repeal part of an Act, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and twenty-eight, chapter twenty-one.—1832, ch. 76.

SEC. 1. *Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the seventh section of an act, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and twenty-eight, chapter 21, be, and the same is, hereby repealed.

Compensa-
tion to clerk

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the clerk to the commissioners for Anne Arundel county, shall be entitled to, and receive as a compensation for his services, such sum annually, as the said commissioners may direct, not exceeding the sum of three hundred dollars, to be levied on the assessable property of said county, collected and paid over as other county charges.

A SUPPLEMENT to an ACT, passed at December session eighteen hundred and twenty-eight, chapter twenty-one, entitled an Act to abolish the Levy Court of Anne Arundel County, and for other purposes.—1838, ch. 273.

That the persons qualified to vote for delegates to the general assembly in Anne Arundel county and the city of Annapolis, at the time and places of election in said county and city of Annapolis, on the first Wednesday in October next, shall vote by ballot for seven persons, (one from each election district in said county, and one from the city of Annapolis) having the same qualifications, as are required for delegates to the general assembly of Maryland, to be commissioners for Anne Arundel county; and the judges of election in said county, for each district and the city of Annapolis, shall make a return in form and manner, similar to their certificates and return of other elections, the number of votes given for commissioners as aforesaid; and the return judges for said county and city, shall ascertain the whole number of votes given for each person voted for as commissioner; and the said judges shall by a certificate to be filed with the clerk of Anne Arundel county court, and by him recorded, certify in a form similar to the certificate of the election of delegates, that the seven persons voted for as commissioners, who shall have received the highest number of votes, are duly elected commissioners for Anne Arundel county; and the said judges shall also state in said certificate the number of votes given for each one of the commissioners elected; of whom the three receiving the highest number of votes shall serve three years; the two receiving the next highest number of votes shall serve two years; and the two receiving the lowest number of votes shall serve one year; and in the event of a tie between any of the commissioners elected as aforesaid, they shall determine by lot the length of time that each shall serve, and their places shall be supplied by the annual election in said county,
