

the clerk of the county court, expressing the number of days which any juryman may have attended, and the sum due to him for such attendance, shall be a sufficient authority to the cashier of the said bank to pay the amount so specified in the said certificate.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the said justices of the levy court shall, annually, settle and balance their account with the said bank, and the surplus, if any, to be applied by the said justices to the use and benefit of the said county. Accounts to be annually settled with bank.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That until the said sum of money shall be so as aforesaid levied and collected, the justices of the levy court of the said county shall and they are hereby authorized to defray the allowance of jurymen of the said county court, out of the money belonging to Anne Arundel county, deposited in the Farmers Bank of Maryland, to be drawn therefrom by a certificate, signed by the clerk of the county, in the manner above directed. Until money is levied allowance to be defrayed out of money belonging to county in bank.

AN ACT to exempt certain Persons from serving as Jurors in the Courts of Anne Arundel County.—1828, ch. 106.

SEC. 1. *Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That from and after the passage of this act, the justices of the orphans court, and the commissioners for Anne Arundel county, be and they are hereby exempt from serving as jurors in the courts of Anne Arundel county. Persons exempted from serving as jurors.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That it shall not be lawful hereafter for the sheriff of Anne Arundel county, to summon either a justice of the orphans court, or a commissioner for Anne Arundel county, to serve as a juror in the county courts of said county. Not to be summoned hereafter.

JUSTICES OF THE PEACE.

AN ACT to establish the Jurisdiction of Justices of the Peace and Constables residing in the City of Annapolis, and Justices of the Peace and Constables of Anne Arundel County, in certain cases therein mentioned. 1826, ch. 75.

WHEREAS, great inconvenience and injury have been experienced by citizens of Anne Arundel county, in consequence of the liability of their persons to seizure under warrants and executions whilst within the limits of the city of Annapolis, for the recovery of small debts previously contracted in said city; therefore, Preamble

SEC. 1. *Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That from and after the passage of this act, no justice of the peace or constable residing in the city of Annapolis, shall have jurisdiction over the persons of citizens resident of Anne Arundel county, whilst within the limits of said city, by issuing or serving warrants, or *capias ad satisfaciendum*, against citizens No justice or constable in Annapolis to have jurisdiction over residents in Anne Arundel county.
