

A further SUPPLEMENT to the ACT, entitled, an Act relating to the City of Baltimore.—1828, ch. 114.

Ordinances relating to appointments. SEC. 1. *Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the mayor and city council of Baltimore may pass ordinances regulating the manner of appointing persons to office under said corporation, which they are now or may hereafter be authorized by law to appoint, any thing in the second section of the act to which this is a supplement, to the contrary notwithstanding.

AN additional SUPPLEMENT to the ACT, entitled, an Act relating to the City of Baltimore.—1829, ch. 111.

General powers granted. *Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the mayor and city council of Baltimore shall hereafter have and possess, full power to pass all ordinances necessary for grading, regulating, paving and repairing the foot-ways, in the streets, lanes and alleys of the city of Baltimore, and to impose a tax on any lot or lots, fronting on any paved street, lane or alley, within the said city for the purpose of grading, regulating, paving or repairing the foot-ways in front thereof, or to compel by fine or otherwise, the proprietor or proprietors of any lot or lots to pave or repair the foot-ways in front thereof, agreeably to the ordinances to be passed upon the subject.

A further SUPPLEMENT to the ACT, entitled, an Act relating to the City of Baltimore.—1829, ch. 114.

Authority granted. SEC. 1. *Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the mayor and city council of Baltimore, be, and they are hereby authorized to pass such ordinance or ordinances for the purpose of altering or changing the grade of any street, lane or alley in the city of Baltimore, as they may deem most advisable; **Conditional** *Provided,* that no such alteration shall be made unless the proprietors of the greater number of feet of ground binding or fronting on that part of the street, lane or alley, the grade of which is intended to be changed or altered shall have first made an application in writing to the mayor and city council, for such change or alteration of the street, lane or alley specified in the application.

Ratification required. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall not go into effect until approved of by the mayor and city council of Baltimore.

AN additional ACT relating to the City of Baltimore.—1830, ch. 139.

Extension of limits of taxation. SEC. 1. *Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the governor, by and with the advice and consent of the council, shall appoint, whenever applied to for that purpose by the mayor and city council of Baltimore, three commissioners,
