SEC. 23. And be it enacted. That nothing contained in this State right act, shall be construed so as in any manner to give an uncontrolled right to the corporate authorities of Baltimore, to any sum or sums of money hereby given or granted, but the said sum or sums of money shall be subject to any future disposition of the legislature.

SEC. 24. And be it enacted, That the operation of this act. Operation shall commence and take effect on the first day of April next, 1st April. and that nothing herein contained, shall affect the rights of any auctioneer or auctioneers, who may before the passage of this act, have taken a license from the mayor of the city of Previous Baltimore, and paid for the same to the said mayor, but that licensee such license shall remain in force until the expiration thereof; Provided however, and it shall be the duty of the mayor and Proviso. city council, to account with the treasurer of the western shore Mayor and for the avails of duties accruing in virtue of such license or city council to account commission after the first day of April next, and if the same quarterly shall exceed the appropriation of this act, for deepening and therefor. improving the harbour of the said city, to pay the excess within ten days after the first day of July next, and so in succession after the end of each and every quarter, during the existence of such license or licenses, commission or commissions.

A SUPPLEMENT to the Act, entitled, an Act to regulate Sales by Public Auctions, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and twentyseven.-1828, ch. 148.

SEC. 1. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, Persons ob-That it shall and may be lawful for all persons obtaining a spe-taining special licial license as auctioneer, under the fifth section of the act to cense to sell which this is a supplement, to sell books, stationery, maps or books, &c. prints, by candlelight, any thing in the said section to the con-light. trary notwithstanding.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That all persons obtaining a Persons license as auctioneer under the sixth section of the said act, for licensed to the purpose of selling furniture and wearing apparel, lands, lots &c. of ground, and other articles mentioned in the said sixth section, and shall pay for the said license the sum of three hundred dollars, and enter into recognizance prescribed in the said sixth section for said license, shall have the liberty to sell, under the provisions of said law, jewelry, watches, tin-ware, guns, pistols, lamps, candlesticks and mechanics' tools.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That all real estate and vessels sales of sold by any auctioneer under the said law, shall be subject to real estate, &c. to be the same duty which is paid on other articles, except the same subject to be sold by an executor or administrator of any deceased person, duty that is or under distress for rent, or taken in execution, or as effects of paid on other any bankrupt or insolvent debtor, transferred or conveyed to articles.
