Sec. 10. And be it enacted, That the sum of thirty thousand Recognidollars, in which an auctioneer, appointed under the act of sance under former act December session, eighteen hundred and twenty-seven, chapter reduced. one hundred and eleven, is required, by the fourth section of the said act, to enter into recognizance, with two sufficient sureties, be, and the same hereby is reduced to ten thousand dollars, and that so much of the said act as is inconsistent herewith, be, and the same hereby is repealed; Provided, nothing herein contained, shall operate to affect any recognizance heretofore entered into.

SEC. 11. And be it enacted, That the annual report of the Annual mayor and city council of Baltimore, required by the twenty-report of mayor, &c. second section of the act to which this is a supplement, to be made on or before the first day of January in each and every year, may be made on or before the twentieth day of January hereafter, any thing in said section, or in any law of this state. to the contrary notwithstanding.

Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, Number to That the mayor of the city of Baltimore, be, and he is hereby be appointauthorized to appoint, during pleasure, not less than twentyfive, and not exceeding one hundred bailitfs, for the purpose of aiding in the preservation of the peace, the maintenance of the laws, and the advancement of the police and good government of said city.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That the mayor and city council Mayor and of Baltimore, be, and they are hereby authorized and directed, city council to prescribe the duties, designate the badges and weapons, and their duties. provide for the compensation of said bailiffs, in such manner as effectually to secure the important objects of their appointment.

BRIDGES.

An Acr to Repair the Highways and Bridges in certain parts of the City of Baltimore.-1823, ch. 185.

WHEREAS, it has been represented to the general assembly of Preamble. the state of Maryland, that the highways and bridges in that part of the city of Baltimore lying without the limits of direct taxation, but within the exterior limits of the city, are frequently rendered impassable, to the very great injury and inconvenience of the community, in consequence of there being no appropriation of money for the purpose of keeping them in repair; therefore,

SEC. 1. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, Power to That the mayor and city council of Baltimore shall have power tax
