

papers as will consent to publish the same, at least two weeks, before the said first Monday of August, and to be continued for at least two weeks, and in case of a change of such being made by the said registers they shall at once publish in the said papers notice of such change, as often as they may deem proper, the expenses of giving the said notices to be paid for as all the other expenses of carrying this law into effect by the mayor and city council of Baltimore.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That the said registers shall procure at the cost of the corporation of the said city of Baltimore, suitable books for the registration of the names of voters, the said books to be so arranged as to admit of the alphabetical classification of the names.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That the said registers shall register in said books, the name of each and every person who shall apply to be so registered, and who shall be known to the said registers, or who shall prove by evidence, satisfactory to them, that he is a bona fide resident of the ward, and is or will be duly qualified to vote in the city of Baltimore, at the next election, according to the constitution and laws of Maryland, and of the United States, and the said registers shall require every person so applying to be registered, and by them adjudged entitled to be registered, to state, in addition to his name, the name of the street, lane or alley, in which he may reside, and whether he be a householder or a lodger, and if a lodger, the name and residence of his landlord or landlady, and in case there be no number to the house, to designate its location in some other explicit mode, all of which particulars shall be plainly entered opposite to his name upon the registering books.

SEC. 7. *And be it enacted*, That lest any person duly qualified to vote, within the city of Baltimore, might by the operation of the above section, be deprived, from absence, sickness or other cause, of an opportunity of registering his name, it shall be lawful for any citizen of good credit to apply to the said registers to register the name of any person, a legally qualified voter, who may be known to him to be temporarily absent from the city, or so sick or infirm as to be unable to apply in person to be registered; but the person so applying to register the name of another, shall be required to state, under oath or affirmation if required by the registers, the name of the person whose name he proposes to register, the street, lane or alley, in which he may reside, and the number or other designation of his house, and whether he be a householder or a lodger, and if a lodger, the name of his landlord or landlady, and the registers shall enter upon the registering books, the name of the said absentee, if adjudged by them to be duly qualified, and along with it, the name and residence of the person by whom his name is registered.
