of Maryland, with good and sufficient securities to be approved by the governor and council, in the penal sum of ten thousand dollars, conditioned for the true and faithful discharge of his duties as inspector, arising out of this or any other law of this

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That the assistant inspectors Assistant shall, at the end of every month, pay over, with an account inspectors to account under oath, to the general inspector, all moneys received by under oath them for their services as inspectors, or for charges of inspecting, under the act to which this is a supplement, or under any monthly. other act or ordinance whatsoever: and the said general inspector shall monthly divide in equal portions among the said Division inspectors and the said general inspector, the amounts so re-directed. ceived by him; and in like manner the said general inspector shall quarterly divide in equal portions among said assistant inspectors and said general inspector, the proceeds of the draw- And of ings of flour herein after authorized to be sold by said general drawings.

SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That the general inspector of Inspector's flour, to be appointed by virtue of this act, shall keep a public office. office in some convenient place in the said city, and shall procure samples, which shall be quarterly renewed, of the most samples approved brands of flour of the inspection of other places. He shall also at the time of entering upon his official duties as general inspector (and quarter-yearly thereafter) upon consultation with the other inspectors and two of the commissioners of review, to be designated for that purpose by the mayor, fix a standard for flour of each degree of fineness, for the regulation standard of the inspection thereof in the said city, which standard shall for flour. not be inferior in quality to flour of the best brands of any other inspection in the United States; and shall, as well as the samples aforesaid, be safely kept at the said public office, subject at all times, in the presence of the said general inspector, to examithe examination of the citizens of this state, or other persons nation. concerned in the purchase or sale of flour therein.

A board is created to fix the standard of flour, by 1833, ch. 246, sec. 2.

SEC. 5. And be it enacted, That in addition to the brand Additional now required to be made upon each cask of flour, the inspector shall, at the time of inspecting the same, brand thereon the year and month of his so inspecting it.

SEC. 6. And be it enacted, That in all cases of appeal from Appeal the judgment of any inspector of flour, the three persons who from judgment of shall review the same, shall first take an oath to decide the case inspector. to be reviewed, agreeably to the standard to be fixed as aforesaid by the general inspector, and kept in said public office, and shall then proceed to view and carefully examine the flour
