

be appointed by the governor and council; that it shall not be lawful for any person or persons residing in the city of Baltimore, to sell or dispose of any lime in barrels or casks, which shall not have been first inspected and branded by some one of the inspectors appointed under this act; and that any person or persons so selling or disposing of any lime in barrels or casks, not branded by some one of the said inspectors, shall forfeit for each and every offence the sum of ten dollars, to be recovered before some justice of the peace in said city.

Executive shall appoint inspectors.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the ninth, tenth, eleventh and twelfth sections of said act, be and the same are hereby repealed.

A SUPPLEMENT to an ACT, entitled, an Act for the Appointment of Lime Inspectors for the City of Baltimore.—1836, ch. 301.

*Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That from and after the first day of March next, all such parts of the act passed at December session, eighteen hundred and thirty-two, chapter two hundred and sixty-nine, as require the inspection of lime brought to the city of Baltimore by land or water, shall also apply to all lime made within the limits of said city.

LIVE STOCK.

AN ACT for the establishment of a Market for the sale of Live Stock, in or near Baltimore Town.—1793, ch. 59.

This law was not carried into operation.

AN ACT to provide for the Appointment of a Weigh-master of Live Stock in the City of Baltimore.—1837, ch. 313.

SEC. 1. *Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the governor be, and he is hereby authorized and required to appoint, with the consent of the senate, a commissioner, whose duty it shall be to purchase a lot of ground within the limits of the city of Baltimore, not exceeding two acres, to be conveyed to the state, lay out and divide the same in such manner as to his judgment may appear best suited to the ends intended by this act, and upon advertising three weeks in some one of the newspapers printed in said city, for proposals, contract for the erecting, on said lot, a platform scale, suitable for weighing live stock, a building of good and substantial materials for the office of weigh-master, not exceeding twenty by sixteen feet in dimensions, nor more than one story high, together with the necessary enclosures; and upon entering into any contract or contracts for putting up said improvements, he shall require bond, with sufficient security, for the faithful performance thereof.
