

reside within their respective districts; and if any officer shall neglect or refuse to comply with any of the provisions of this section, as required of him, he shall be fined a sum not exceeding fifty dollars, in the discretion of such court martial as the case may require; and no uniformed volunteer company of cavalry shall consist of more than sixty men; no uniformed volunteer company of artillery shall consist of more than ninety men; and no uniformed volunteer company of infantry or riflemen shall consist of more than one hundred men, exclusive of the commissioned officers of each; and if any commanding officer of such company shall admit a greater number of men than are authorized by this section, he shall be fined a sum not exceeding twenty dollars, in the discretion of such court martial as the case may require.

Penalty.

Officers to uniform and equip themselves.

SEC. 46. *And be it enacted,* That any officer holding a commission and not uniformed, who shall not within three months after the passage of this act, and any officer hereafter appointed who shall not within twenty days after the acceptance of such appointment, arm, accoutre and provide himself with the uniform established agreeably to the provisions of this act, if a company or regimental staff officer, he shall be fined a sum not exceeding twenty dollars, in the discretion of such court martial as the case may require; and if a general, or regimental field officer, or division, or brigade staff officer, he shall be fined a sum not exceeding fifty dollars, in the discretion of such court martial as the case may require; and if any officer shall thereafter continue such neglect, he shall be liable to be cashiered at any time by such court martial as the case may require.

Penalty.

Non-commissioned officer's appointment.

SEC. 47. *And be it enacted,* That the commanding officer of each company shall appoint and dismiss at his pleasure, his non-commissioned officers; and if any person so appointed and having accepted such appointment, shall neglect or refuse to obey the orders of his superior officers in executing the provisions of this act, he shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten dollars, in the discretion of such court martial as the case may require.

Penalty for not serving.

Certificates of volunteers.

SEC. 48. *And be it enacted,* That all certificates of membership issued by the commanding officer of an uniformed volunteer company, be signed by the said commanding officer and one of his commissioned officers, and the said commanding officer shall cause said certificate to be delivered on or before the first day of March, in each year, to such persons as may then compose his company, and to such as may join thereafter, upon the day of his or their becoming members; and if the said commanding officer shall neglect or refuse to comply therewith, he shall be fined a sum not exceeding fifty dollars, in the discretion of such court martial as the case may require; and the
