

commissions of officers and all such certificates shall be respected by the enrolling officers commanding company districts, as well as the courts of appeal that shall be held for the trials of the appeals of their company officers, non-commissioned officers and privates, as absentees from parade, from their date and for the period for which they were given, unless they are sooner revoked by the commanding officer of said volunteer company, or by the governor and council, or by the cashiering of an officer holding the same, as the case may be: *Provided*, that the person holding such commission or certificate, shall either exhibit or transmit the same to the enrolling officer of the district in which he resides, previous to the first parade as prescribed by this act, or to any court of appeal as aforesaid, that shall be held for said district, after he shall have received the same: *And provided*, that the exemption arising from the sentence of such court of appeal can only take effect for the meeting they are appointed to decide upon, and for any subsequent meeting within the year; and the commanding officer of the regiment in whose district such person shall reside, shall thereupon cause his name to be stricken from the muster roll of the district company in which he is enrolled, under a penalty not exceeding twenty dollars, in the discretion of such court martial as the case may require; and if any commissioned officer shall issue such certificate to any person who is not entitled under the provisions of this act to receive the same, he shall be cashiered or fined not exceeding one hundred dollars, in the discretion of such court martial as the case may require; and if any person shall give or receive such certificate who is not authorized to give, or entitled to receive the same by the provisions of this act, such person shall forfeit and pay the sum of fifty dollars, which shall be recovered under the direction of any officer discovering the same, and when collected shall be paid over to the paymaster of the regiment to which said officer is attached, for the use of said regiment.

Penalty for giving undue certificates.

SEC. 49. *And be it enacted*, That if any commissioned officer shall be guilty of any breach of orders, or shall at any division, regimental or company meetings, on any other occasion in the execution of the provisions of this act, or when the division, regiment or company, to which he may belong, or in or over which he holds a command, is paraded or on duty as prescribed by this act, or in the by-laws of any company, misbehave, demean himself, or appear in an unofficer-like manner, he shall for such offence, be cashiered, suspended, reprimanded, or fined not exceeding one hundred dollars, in the discretion of such court martial as the case may require; and the proceedings of every court martial in case of cashiering, shall be transmitted to the commander-in-chief for his approbation or disapproba-
