And be it enacted, That all expenses attending the Assessment repairs, alterations and improvements of the jail, and of the property appertaining thereto, shall be paid for in equal proportions. by Baltimore county and Baltimore city; and all other necessarv expenses incurred by the said visitors, shall be paid by Baltimore county and Baltimore city, in the proportions properly chargeable to the said county and city respectively, having regard to the number of prisoners and the expense of keeping the same, which shall have been sent from the county and from the city.
