A S S E S S M E N T .

AN ACT for the re-valuation of the Real and Personal Property in Calvert County.—1834, ch. 205.

Re-assessment authorized.

Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the county commissioners for Calvert county, be, and they are hereby authorized to meet at Prince Fredericktown, as soon as may be practicable after the passage of this act, and there proceed to re-value and re-assess the real and personal property within said county, agreeably to the provisions of an act, passed at November session, eighteen hundred and twelve, entitled, an act for the valuation of real and personal property in the several counties of this state.

C L E R K O F C O U N T Y C O U R T .

AN ACT to empower the Clerk of Calvert County to remove certain Records from the Seat of Justice.—1804, ch. 102.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, by a law passed in the year seventeen hundred and forty-eight, chapter seven, the several clerks of the counties were authorized to remove out of their offices the four last dockets and papers, and the situation of the clerk of Calvert county rendering it expedient to extend the number of dockets which he may be permitted to remove; therefore,

Clerk may remove certain dockets.

SEC. 2. *Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That it shall and may be lawful for the clerk of Calvert county to take, remove, or carry out of his public office, the last eight court dockets and papers next preceding the time of such taking out, and the same to keep at his own house, or any other place more suitable to his conveniency within the county, for and during such time as to him shall seem necessary, without being liable to incur the penalty imposed by law for removing records.
