## REGISTER.

An Acr to compel the Registers of Wills in the several Counties herein mentioned to keep each his Office at the Seat of Justice in the County for which he shall be Register.-1804, ch. 39.

SEC. 1. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, Offices to That from and after the passage of this act, it shall be, and is the place hereby declared to be, the duty of the registers of wills for the where time being of the several counties herein mentioned, to wit: county Saint-Mary's, Kent, Charles, Talbot, Dorchester, Worcester, held. Harford, Washington and Montgomery counties, to keep each his office at the place where the county court is held for his respective county, and there to deposite and keep all the papers belonging to his said office.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That it shall also be the duty of Registers the said registers to give daily attendance at their offices, either to give daily atin person or by deputy, for the purpose of discharging the tendance. duties incident thereto, except on Sundays, and unless prevented by sickness, or some unavoidable accident.

SEC. 3. Provided nevertheless, and be it enacted, That no- Proviso. thing herein contained shall be construed, or have effect in any manner, to authorize a deputy to transact any part of the business or duties of the said office which is or may by law be required to be executed by the register in person, and it is hereby declared to be the duty of the said registers, at all times after the passage of this act, to attend at their respective offices, in person, unless prevented as aforesaid, at least two days in every week.
