Expulsion authorized. joying all the benefits and advantages of the school in the district where such child or children may reside; and further, that the trustees, or a majority of them, shall have full power to expel any pupil or pupils from the schools, at any time, for immorality or extraordinary or continued insubordination, gross inattention, or other improper conduct.

School fund to be paid to county clerk.

SEC. 6. And be it enacted. That Kent county's proportion of the state school fund shall not be paid, as heretofore, by the treasurer, to the order of the orphans court, but to the clerk of the county, or his order, who, in the month of November, in each year, shall apportion the same equally among the several school districts, that shall have reported to him before such distribution, and pay over to the order of said trustees of the several and respective school districts, the proportion or part of such free school fund, as such district may have been entitled to, under the apportionment by the said clerk, and the said clerk shall apply for and receive from the treasurer of the western shore, annually, the amount of the county's share of the state school fund, and in an annual report to the said treasurer, embrace a full and detailed account of the manner in which he has disposed of the same, and for the faithful and punctual payment and disbursement herein and herein after directed, his official bond shall be liable to be sued by the trustees, for the time being, of any school district, or a majority of them, or by the district in its corporate name, although it shall form no express provision in the condition of his bond; and the clerk of said county shall be entitled, in addition to such charges as now allowed by law for similar services, such compensation as is now allowed to the treasurer of said school fund for said county, and all which shall be levied upon and paid as other county charges.

SEC. 7. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the commissioners and inspectors of the second election district, to cause to be published at the close of each and every year, at the expense of the school districts, in their said election districts, a synopsis, shewing the aggregate of the state fund and apportionment of the same, in some convenient newspaper, for the information of the public.

SEC. 8. And be it enacted, That the collectors shall pay to the trustees, or a majority of them, of any district, or to their order, after the expiration of the period allowed by law for the completion of their collections, the funds which he may be And report, liable to pay, and report to the trustees, or a majority of them, whenever required, the amount of funds in his hands, and the amount then due and uncollected, and a full and accurate statement of his accounts; and if, at the end of any year, an unappropriated balance shall remain in his or their hands, or
