

prove such receipt, acquittance, release, or final discharge; *Provided*, the same is duly attested, under the seal of office of the said register of wills, accompanied by this certificate, that the said receipt, acquittance, release or final discharge is destroyed and lost. Proviso.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That a copy of the entry of any voucher or evidence, of a claim against any deceased's estate, which hath been filed, entered and allowed in any account of an administrator, administratrix, executor, or executrix in the register of wills' office, in Saint Mary's county, shall be admitted as prima facie evidence in the place of such voucher or evidence, of a claim as aforesaid; *Provided*, the same is duly attested by the register of wills for said county, under his hand and seal of office, accompanied by his certificate, that the said voucher or evidence of a claim aforesaid is destroyed or lost. Vouchers, &c. made valid evidence.  
Proviso.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That a copy of the entry of any voucher or evidence of the payment, of any sum of money, or for any article or other thing, which hath been filed, entered and allowed, in any account of a guardian in the register of wills' office, in the county aforesaid, shall be admitted as prima facie evidence, to prove such voucher or evidence of the payment of any sum of money, or for any article or other thing, for his, her or their ward; *Provided*, the same be duly attested, and certified as aforesaid. Copy of entry of vouchers, &c. made evidence.  
Proviso.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That the register of wills for Saint Mary's county, shall be entitled to receive for any services he may perform under the provisions of this act, the same fees as he is entitled to by law for similar services. Fees.

RETAILERS.

A SUPPLEMENT to the ACT, entitled, an Act to regulate the issuing of Licenses to Traders, Keepers of Ordinaries, and others.—1837, ch. 124.

*Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That from and after the passage of this act, no licensed retailer of spirituous liquors in Saint Mary's county, shall be held to answer for any violation of the supposed prohibition in the license laws of this state, which forbids such licensed retailers to permit spirituous liquors sold by them to be drunk in or about their premises, but that all such supposed prohibitions, so far as they relate to Saint Mary's county, be, and the same are hereby repealed. Drinking on or about the premises in Saint Mary's county.
