

not less than five nor more than twenty dollars for each and every offence, to be recovered before any justice of the peace in the city of Baltimore.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That hereafter the general inspector and three assistant inspectors of flour, shall apportion among themselves the whole expenses of their respective offices, and each shall bear and pay an equal part of such expenses, and in like manner the proceeds of their offices as inspectors, and of the sales of the drawings, shall be equally divided among them, any thing in any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

Expenses and proceeds to be apportioned.

AN ACT, Supplemental to an Act, providing for the appointment of Lime Inspectors for the City of Baltimore, and prescribing their duties, passed December session, eighteen hundred and thirty-two.—1839, ch. 290.

SEC. 1. *Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That there be annually appointed for the city of Baltimore, two persons well skilled in the quality of lime, to measure and inspect all lime made in or brought to the city of Baltimore for sale, or to be used therein in wagons, carts or other carriages, which shall be measured by the Winchester bushel, containing twenty-one hundred and fifty cubic inches.

Two inspectors to be appointed.

Mode of measurement.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the mayor be, and is hereby authorized to designate two stands for the inspection and measurement of lime in such part of the city as the public convenience, agreeably to his judgment may require, and the said inspectors shall change their stands alternately on the Monday of each week.

Mayor to designate stands.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That all lime made in or brought to the city of Baltimore, by land, for sale or to be used therein, except in cars on the rail road, and in which case the inspectors must inspect on the road within the limits of the city, by being duly notified that such lime is there for inspection, and all other lime brought to the city, shall be taken to one of the stands appointed, and there submitted on the same day on which it was sold, to the inspection and measurement of the persons appointed as aforesaid, who shall inspect the same in the wagon, cart or other carriage in which it is brought, agreeable to the standard hereafter mentioned, and give the seller a certificate of the quantity thereof, and also of its quality, that whether it be first, second or third quality, for which certificate he shall be entitled to receive three-fourths of a cent per bushel for his compensation.

Lime, except brought by rail road, to be taken to the stands.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted,* That all lime that is imported into, or exported, or intended to be exported from the city, sold or used therein in barrels, hogsheads, or other casks, shall be inspected by one of the said inspectors; and all bar-
